COMBINATION DRAG BRUSH & MAT

Synthetic grass pitches are installed by skilled operatives using only the highest quality materials. Consequently the maintenance requirement of these pitches is low. It is however essential that, right from the outset, a regular routine of maintenance is established to keep the playing surface in peak condition. Our combination Drag Brush & Mat has been designed to assist the maintenance process in ensuring carpet infill levels are evenly distributed minimising wear to the carpet and player injury.

- They are rigid and durable, constructed from a fully galvanised steel triangular frame attached to a plywood body.
- Dimensions: 2 x 2 x 2 metres; approx. weight 50 kg.
- 6 no 950 x 100 x 100 mm polypropylene rigid-bristle brush-heads are attached to the underside of the frame, and a synthetic carpet covers the top, enabling dual brush and mat usage simply by turning the frame over.
- Their unique triangular symmetrical design, with quick-snap drag-chain attachment, prolongs effective brush life by enabling the frame to be towed from alternate corners, preventing bristle-bend in a single direction through continuous mono-directional usage.
- The bolted modular design enables individual worn components to be replaced with relative ease.
- Optional corner rollers can be added to enable the frame to be manually transported in an upright position by a single operative.
